

CONCLUSION

To sum up, I think as an English learner who had many different teachers with various traits and teaching methodologies, to adhere to a single approach is not practical. There are still language teachers who are used to rote-teaching and old methods. While others are trying to motivate their students and use the more modern approaches, which focus on making learners independent and encourage them to learn and use the language in a more natural way.
